A message from Terry Foley




Happy Easter!



Beyond the numbers from Myra: Donna

We often hear words of empowerment from the Pope, encouraging us each day to make changes in our lives and society. Making these changes will help us to become the hands and the feet of Jesus Christ. Myra Bradley, The Family Care Coordinator at CPO, demonstrates daily how a grant through United Way, and the collaboration of local community agencies such as StepUp Ministry, Alliance Medical Ministry, Dress For Success, The Boys and Girls Clubs and Childcare Resources, are the hands and feet that make a difference in the lives of our clients and in our community.

A grant that started in September has helped our clients not only to receive food, but jobs, employment training, professional clothing, medical care, and childcare resources assistance.

In November 2015, Donna came into CPO seeking assistance for food. She was discouraged, disappointed and depressed because she had no job, a criminal background and no hope for a brighter future. After speaking with Myra, she was signed up to attend a Jobs Orientation training at StepUp Ministry.

This was the beginning of a turnaround for our client. She attended the week long orientation and began to

feel that there was a possibility for her to move forward and set a good example for her son. Donna began to feel encouraged; she attended the weekly Energy Meeting that Step Up Ministry hosts on Wednesdays, and was then encouraged to get her son involved. He is now enrolled in The Boys and Girls Clubs. She attended the weekly meetings at StepUp Ministry, and she recently found employment through the program.

We congratulate Donna and her son for becoming a part of the Family Table Collaborative, and we wish her well on her journey.
